Courtney is a school administrator in Lacey and she and her husband Garin are the parents of two teens, one of whom is queer. She helped advocate through the Washington State Human Rights Commission for the rights of students in public schools to use the bathroom of their affirmed gender.

"I am forever in debt to this organization and how it has helped my family and countless others better understand, advocate and support our gay and transgender community," said Schrieve, who has been a member of PFLAG for about a year. As President she hopes to make PFLAG more visible to the community-at-large, especially in the schools. "I love how multigenerational and diverse PFLAG members are. It just goes to show us that we all have something in common no matter where we come from, how old we are or what our gender or sexuality."

Courtney says she is in debt to the Claytons for their leadership and is looking forward to working with the new Board to offer education, advocacy and support for gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered persons, their families and friends.

Robert is a high school student and will be the youngest member ever to serve as a board officer. His father, Jason McCormick, is also a new board member; and his mother, Dana, intends to join the board after her deployment to Korea. Dana and Jason are both in the Army.

Robert says, "I am very pleased to assume the position of Vice President of the Olympia chapter of PFLAG. I have been coming to PFLAG for about a year and have found PFLAG to be a warm welcoming environment that I love being a part of. A little about myself, I am a sophomore at North Thurston High. I am also an active member of Future Business Leaders of America, Distributive Education Clubs of America, Gay Straight Alliance, Stonewall Youth and Pizza Klatch. I am what you would call a "Military Brat" I was born in upstate New York, just outside of Fort Drum in 1997. In August of 2000 I moved to Germany where I spent the next 9 years experiencing life abroad. In September of 2009 my family and I moved to Lacey, where I believe we have found our forever home. #### Teen Files: The Truth About Hate

Many members and friends of PFLAG-Olympia and community folks are aware of the story of Bill Clayton, the son of Alec and Gabi Clayton who took his own life in 1995 at the age of 17 following a bashing based on his sexual orientation. Gabi was invited to appear in a made-fortelevision documentary shot in 1998. When she agreed she was flown to San Francisco and filmed telling Bill's story to a group of self-avowed homophobic youth.

The film, Teen Files: The Truth About Hate, looks into racial and ethnic based hate, religious intolerance, homophobia and more. Anti-Semitic teens listen to a holocaust survivor, rival Hispanic and Armenian students spend time together, teens meet a young black man who was paralyzed after a racist assault. In the section Gabi is in a police officer who works on hate crimes takes the homophobic youth to visit a shelter for LGBT youth. And in the final part, filmed at a diversity boot camp, kids from different backgrounds learn to work together to survive in the wilderness.

It is a very moving and ultimately a hopeful film. Gabi will be with us to talk about the experience after we watch the film. We may have to shorten some other parts of the meeting to fit this in or perhaps extend the meeting time until 4:30 p.m.
