At that time I was struggling with the realization that my child had a different gender identity than the one we assigned to him at birth. I was confused, sad, guilty and very alone. I floated into the church not knowing who I would meet or if they'd even understand what I was going through. I was also wondering, "why is it at a church...will they make me join?"

I need not have worried. Within minutes of arriving they had offered me snacks, hugs and their stories which were very similar to mine. During sharing I realized PFLAG-Olympia was not just for "allies" but also provided a respite and support group for members of the LGBQT community. It was a very safe place where anyone was welcome, not judged; listened to and not silenced.

If you come to our "circle" on Sunday you will realize that PFLAG-Olympia members are everywhere and everyone. We are students, grandparents, partners, husbands, wives, friends, family, straight, gay, transgender, military, and all colors of this magnificent rainbow of humanity. We are there to advocate and educate but mostly support each other. It is a huge sigh of relief for many of us to finally find others who understand and appreciate us and our loved ones.

I am blessed to have the support and encouragement of such amazing former Board members as Alec and Gabi Clayton, Lacey Mayor Virgil Clarkson and Catherine Dawdy. Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA)

The law, which codifies the non-recognition of same-sex marriages for all federal purposes, including Social Security survivors' benefits, immigration and insurance benefits for government employees. An appeal is scheduled to be heard by the U.S. Supreme Court on March 27, 2013.
