THE CHANGING FACE OF PFLAG: NOT JUST FOR ALLIES ANYMORE

If you have been to a PFLAG-Olympia meeting lately you might notice the changing face of our membership and attendees. We have parents, grandparents and relatives of gay adults; we have parents of transgender youth and transgender adults looking for support and resources; we have gay, lesbian, transgender and bi-sexual members, some of whom have been out for years and others who have never told anyone until a PFLAG meeting.

What started over 40 years ago with one mother (PFLAG founder Jeanne Manford) marching in support of her gay son, grew to become an international organization that unites parents, families, friends and allies to united with LGBTQ people in a shared mission of support, education and advocacy. Today, PFLAG national educates lawmakers on Capitol Hill about hate crime prevention and anti-bullying legislation. They advocate for workplace fairness, safe schools and parenting.

At the recent Capital City Pride parade, PFLAG members were joined by their partners from the Tacoma chapter. Several people commented on the changing face of the parade attendees and those at their meetings: more transgender youth and adults, more parents seeking help for their transgender children. Thankfully there are more resources for queer youth today, like Pizza Klatch and Stonewall Youth.

The success of R74 was a historic event for families across the state and momentum continues to build across the country, we as PFLAG still have work to do. As PFLAG national states in their strategic goals, "we need to create a world where are young people can grow up without fear of violence, bullying or other forms of discrimination regardless of their real or perceived gender identity or sexual orientation or that of their families."

We hope that more people will join PFLAG-Olympia as we continue to work for a world with respect, dignity and equality for all. We still have lots of work to do in areas of inclusion in faith, safe workplaces, and accessibility for a broad range of ethnic and cultural communities.

MILESTONES OF PFLAG

1972: Jeanne Manford marches in New York's Christopher Street Liberation day March

1973: New York City Parents of Gays holds its first meeting in Greenwich Village. About 20 people attended.

1980s: Federation of Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (Parents FLAG) is incorporated. PFLAG takes on Anita Bryant's anti-gay crusade and works to end the U.S. military's efforts to discharge lesbians.

1993: PFLAG added the word "families" to the name and added bisexual people to its mission and work.

1998: PFLAG added transgender people to its mission.

Today: PFLAG has more than 350 chapters worldwide, with more than 200,000 members and supporters.
