s I stood in the freezing cold of Sylvester Park on Nov. 20, I was warmed not only by over 100 candles flickering in the dark but also by the love of the supportive crowd celebrating Transgender Day of Remembrance. The vigil is in memory of Rita Hester, a transgender woman who was killed in 1998. Our lovely MC Anais solemnly read the names of transgender victims of violence in 2013 — 238 in all. Some were beaten, one beheaded and others burned.

Despite our progress with Marriage Equality and transgender rights in schools we still have a long way to go to ending the hate and ignorance that permeate our world and communities.

PFLAG-Olympia continues to provide education, advocacy and support for allies as well as the LGBTQQTSA community. Each month we have our regular members who are tireless supporters of the work we do to help create a society that is healthy and respectful of all human diversity. We have parents, questioning individuals, youth, grandparents and friends. Some people come and never come back, but maybe we helped them in some way.

Let's not forget what we're fighting for! No matter what challenges we face, we must continue to work to end discrimination and to secure equal civil rights. Our partners in this mission are many — Stonewall Youth, Pizza Klatch, PIPE, The Olympia Trans Discussion Group, and Safe Schools Coalition, just to name a few. Strength in numbers.
