Homelessness in Olympia: Focus on Queer Youth

magine that you come out to your family as LGBTQ, or maybe just tell them you are questioning, and... they kick you out the house.

Now imagine finding yourself on the street with nowhere to turn. Your main source of income is panhandling, which does not always sit well with local businesses or police. Perhaps you've turned to drugs or alcohol to self-medicate. Sometimes people insult you, beat you or pee on you after the bars close. And if you are lucky enough to get a bed at a shelter, many of them are traditionally binary in gender assignments.

These are some of the real life stories we heard recently at the PFLAG-Olympia program on Homeless Queer Youth. Thanks again to **Cole Ketcherside** from Community Youth Services; **Meg Martin** from the Emma Goldman Youth and Homeless Outreach Project (EGYHOP), Interfaith Works Shelter Coordinator, and Program Director for The People's House; and **Sammy Harvell** from Partners in Prevention Education, Stonewall Youth. These amazing speakers helped us understand the challenges and needs our community's homeless population faces on a daily basis and how queer youth are more at risk. "A lot of good people end up on the streets," Ketcherside said. "That doesn't mean they are bad or unsafe."
