## Where it all began: The Origins of PFLAG-Olympia

PFLAG of Thurston County (now known as PFLAG-Olympia) was started by a small group of citizens in 1993. The idea for creating some kind of advocacy organization in our community for gay/lesbian/bisexual people originated with a conversation between my husband Andy McMillan and me about our concern that anti-gay activities in Oregon (specifically Ballot Measure 9 and Lon Mabon's group, Oregon Citizens Alliance) were probably headed to Washington state next.

As a part-time Evergreen professor and independent trainer/consultant on gender and sexuality issues, I had many contacts in the local gay community. So, Andy and I had a meeting with leaders of gay-related organizations in Olympia (Curt Pavola, David Kindle, Kathryn Ford and others) and asked them what we could do to help our community to

prepare for this eventuality, especially since we were in the state's capital.

One attendee said, "We already have 20 gay rights organizations in this town. What we really need is a PFLAG." Shortly after that, Andy and I attended a GLBT rights rally at Sylvester Park where a young college student, Bryan Kirkpatrick, had a sign-up list for anyone interested in creating a PFLAG chapter. Andy and I were the only signers. We later met with Bryan at a downtown restaurant and planned a PFLAG organizing meeting at a local church.

At that meeting, we met Paul and Betty Beeman, who had a lesbian daughter and were recent members of the PFLAG chapter in Bellingham (they had just moved to Olympia). Paul was a retired Methodist minister. Betty had worked earlier as a secretary for Dan

Evans, the former governor of Washington, while he was president of The Evergreen State College. We were thrilled they had come to join our efforts, and we left the meeting thinking, "Who better to be the face of this organization than the Beemans?!"

Paul and Betty served as co-presidents for many years. Andy and I were active board members for its first three years, Andy as treasurer and political advocacy chair; me as education chair and lead on many fund-raising activities. Other original board members included Kathryn Ford, Ron Hertel, and Stella Warner. Paul Beeman later was elected President of National PFLAG and served for several years.

Our goal was to launch Thurston County PFLAG and get it on a solid footing. Since then, many others have built on that foundation.

## Andy McMillan

B orn and raised in the South, Andy McMillan was an active supporter of equal rights for all, especially GLBTQ people. His father, a liberal Presbyterian minister, had marched and worked with Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. in Alabama during the civil rights movement.



In addition to co-founding Thurston County

PFLAG, Andy volunteered for Hands Off Washington as a "bigot-buster," standing outside public places with HOW pamphlets in one hand and a Bible in the other. Andy testified at numerous legislative hearings about anti -gay bills, and created and co-facilitated several state-wide trainings on "Gays in the Workplace" in his agency, the Washington State Department of Ecology.

In 2005, at age 46, Andy was diagnosed with an aggressive form of multiple myeloma (bone marrow cancer). He died on March 6th of this year.
