East meets West as Spokane's own Auntie Bijou joins Olympia's pride events June 21, beginning with our traditional rally on the Capitol steps, followed by a fabulously rambunctious parade through the downtown. A festival caps off the parade, promising a day filled with eclectic entertainment, some political speakers, poetry readings, and more.

The 13th Annual Capital City Pride begins with free "Pancakes in the Park" sponsored by Olympia's Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG). If you stay for breakfast, join in the stage and set design party going on nearby and help get all in readiness for the day's events. Then, gather at the Capitol steps at 11 a.m. for a rally, followed by the noon parade; the festival will begin shortly thereafter.

The festival will feature booths and information from local agencies and businesses that support the GLBT communities, a raffle of fantastic prizes, entertainment hosted by the brazenly fabulous Auntie Bijou, as well as a kid's bounce room, and lots of fun times had by all.

Attendance is expected to be the largest it has ever been. Food and vendor booths will fill the park. A live stage will have a variety show featuring talent from Olympia, Tacoma, Seattle and the Northwest.

So, grab your blankets and your bubbles and come join in the fun as we collectively show through fun, spirit, and fellowship why it is "We ARE Family."
