### WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

As members of PFLAG, which is a single organization with a very limited scope, when do we begin to broaden our horizons to participate in the broader community? It appears that we have limited ourselves to a very narrow niche, at the same time crave for support, attention and recognition.

As a member of the minority community, my limitations could have been restrained by the many negative forces that had and have been placed upon me and in front of me. But at some early time in my life I had to decide that my limited world and my understanding would allow me to reach beyond my limited experiences.

As an African-American male many barriers were placed before me. I came from a family with no father. My father died when I was 13 months old of diabetes. My mother had very little education. Only completing the 3rd grade. But she instilled in her three children not to limit our selves because of our circumstances.

My older brother completed his PhD in Mathematics and taught at a four year University for more than 50 years. He also contributed to many scientific and Mathematics national and international research organizations. My Sister completed her PhD in environmental medicine. She also taught at a four year University. She developed many young people aspiring to go into the medical and nursing fields.

This brings this discussion to me. Since I was not an academician, my interests were in governmental affairs. I always was interested in how government worked at the basic level. Therefore, I spent most of my work life in government employment;

working for two State agencies here in Washington. But I knew I had something to offer others besides work, not just self-serving.

I saw my work as a means to contribute to the workforce, but not as a means to contribute to my community. Or I could have said as an African American, I can't do things in the broader community. But instead I said In order to fit into my newly adopted community; I began to participate and volunteer in many organizations, and helping to start others. To give examples:

I carried the Torch for the Olympic Games in Chehalis Washington into the city of Olympia.

I was responsible for legislation that passed to benefit all Washington citizens with Diabetes. By reducing the cost of necessary medical supplies and training individuals to manage diabetes. This was signed into law by Governor Locke on January 1, 1998.

As one of the founding members in establishing and chartering the Olympia Opera Guild, it was great moment for culture in our county. 1965

Assisting in getting Open Housing Ordinances passed in the Cities of Lacey, Olympia, Tumwater and Thurston County. 1968

I was a charter member in bringing a branch of the Tacoma Urban League to our community to help support the growing cultural diversity in Thurston County. 1970

Member of Kiwanis Club of Olympia for 40 years. Elected

Lieutenant Governor in 1978.

Member of the Thurston County Fair Board for 25 years. Elected President four times.

A member of the Red Cross of Thurston & Mason County for 7 Years. Elected President in 1990.

Donates a pint of Blood to the Regional Blood Bank every 56 days. I am working on my 200th pint for donation. I have donated 118 pints of blood. Currently, on the Blood Council of South Puget Sound.

1998 - Appointed to the City Council, in Lacey WA

1999 - Elected to the City Council in Lacey WA

2001 - Elected Deputy Mayor

2003 - Elected Mayor to present

Many members in this PFLAG have leadership, great skills and knowledge to share and pass on to others. What can you do? Who can you serve? Or are there other civic contributions you can make?

We need to ask ourselves these questions:

How many community boards do you sit on to provide guidance?

How many youth do you tutor when so many are failing in math and reading, etc.

### Remember this

From Patricia Novotny's opening statement on for the Washington State Supreme Court Marriage Equality Hearing:

We are here to ask merely that Washington fulfill the promise of liberty and equality made to all its citizens. In your assessment of our challenge, I ask the court to look forward, not merely backwards. And to remember that both liberty and equality were and are radical and experimental ideas. That WE as a people embraced democracy not because a study showed us how well it works, but because of our faith in these principles and our trust in the future they would help us to build.

There have been efforts in this case to exploit fear – fear of change, fear of difference. I ask you to consider fear of failure: fear of failing our own promise and destiny. That promise requires vindication of our clients' right to marry.

## It's time for Gay Marriage

Recently there was a discussion in our GLBTQ e-mail reflector at work regarding the Oregon Domestic Partnership law. One person said "Good grief. When will the opponents get it we are not going after marriage?" That got me to thinking ...

I used to believe that we weren't going after marriage — instead, we wanted everyone to have "Civil Unions" that were endorsed by the government, and "Marriages" would be administered by churches. But, I've changed my mind.

Instead, I now strongly believe we are after "Marriage Equality". The primary change I'm working for is to remove the qualification of gender from the U.S. definition of marriage.

This doesn't force any church to perform a marriage, just as they aren't forced to "marry" divorced people. But it unequivocally places a marriage between 2 men or 2 women in the same regard as that between a man and woman.

Anything less is "separate but equal", demeaning to the wonderful gay and lesbian relationships I've witnessed and, in my opinion, not acceptable.

I also believe that Marriage Equality is critical to reduce

stigma towards homosexuality. Allowing me to refer to my heterosexual relationship as a "marriage" (with all its POWERFUL connotations), but an identical gay/lesbian relationships as a "domestic partnership" continues the myth that there is a profound difference.

And finally, I think it's more realistic to expect marriage equality than to change the U.S. definition of marriage to mean only a church-sponsored union. I just don't think you'll get folks to adopt the term "Civil Unions" for all government-sponsored partnerships.

It's time to push for Marriage Equality, and accept nothing less.
