Pizza Klatch Report

The Pizza Klatch has been a great success in providing support to GLBTQ youth through local High School Gay-Straight Alliances. We're serving 40 to 60 youth a week at 2 high schools (North Thurston and Timberline) - GREAT numbers for a GLBTQ support group! Getting enough financing for this many youth (pizzas) is quite a challenge. We've been given amazingly generous donations, held an auction that raised \$5,000, and were given a \$500 grant from the Community Sustaining Fund

(partially financed by "rounding up" at the co-op; tell the clerk there you'd like to do that, if you shop there). We now have enough money to pay for the pizzas for the rest of the year and ½ our desired stipends. But, we're still \$1,500 away from being able to pay our facilitators a full stipend (\$25/week/facilitator). If you're willing to donate to this great effort, please send a check to PFLAG Olympia with "Pizza" in the note section. Some numbers on our costs:

- \$3 a week per student for pizza
- \$5 a week per student for pizza and stipend
- 32 weeks in the school year

So, for \$160, you can fund a student attending the GLBTQ support group for an entire school year.

This has been an incredibly successful and fulfilling venture - one of the most satisfying I've ever participated in. Comments from the students highlight how valuable they've found it. We'd like to figure out how make it sustainable, and possibly expand it to more schools. Here are some things we're thinking about:

Perhaps asking people to make a year-to-year commitment to continue providing funding

Other grants or funding sources?

The youth are also eager to raise funds - we're looking at how to help them do this (car wash, student-designed posters to sell, etc.)

There are 5 things needed to make this work for a school:

1. An active GSA at the school
2. A "champion" within the school - someone to provide a space to meet and help with the logistics
3. Facilitators - right now we have facilitators available
4. Pizza provider - the Hawks Prairie Round Table has been wonderful at providing good, hot pizzas on time at a great price
5. Money (last, but not least)

Right now, we may have 3 of these available in Tumwater. Next year, we hope to have the program going in at least 3 local schools. Thanks all for your wonderful past support. You can expect to hear more about this amazing program!

- 48 paying members
- Our budget was about \$4,000
- We're only \$400 behind for the entire year, and we didn't hold a fund-raising auction
- I finally got a handle on how to use Quicken to track our finances (Thanks Steve!!!)
- We handled \$7,000 for the Pizza Klatch
- We just about broke even at Super Saturday and Pride — sold enough items to fund handing out free pamphlets

Many of our most important functions wouldn't happen without your financial support — such as pink "I'm loved by PFLAG" stickers, pamphlets, library books, DVD's ("It's Elementary", for instance).
